




FOURTEENTH DAY ENROLLED CREDIT HOURS 2008 FALL TERM DMACC – ALL CAMPUSES






FALL 2008–2009 ENROLLMENT BY GENDER ALL CAMPUSES

STUDENT STATUS FALL 2008–2009 ALL CAMPUSES




